



- Make sure students are able to get to their classrooms once the bell rings


After Care

As a part of this program all students will be required to participate in two early morning rehearsals (7:00am-7:40am) as well as two outside of the school day concerts. The regional students who always attend morning rehearsals will also need to be at the two mandatory early morning rehearsals like normal as well as Borgia students. The concert dates and times will be provided later. Both concerts, Christmas and Spring, will be held on a week night and are a part of the grade. During the fall semester the students will march in the Borgia High School Homecoming Parade to learn about marching band as well. The students will also participate in the Archdiocesan Band Festival on a Sunday in February, which is an all day event. The only other events are the one or two band tours that the students will participate in during the spring semester. This will require one or two early mornings as well as full school days. All the events listed above will be listed on a calendar at the start of the year so that they can be put on families calendars ahead of time.
